The Oral Communication portion of the agenda is for members of the public to present items which are not listed on the agenda, but are under the subject matter jurisdiction of the Commission. Although no action may be taken, the Commission and staff will follow up, at an appropriate time, on those items needing response. Each speaker is limited to (3) three minutes. Time may be surrendered by deferring (1) one minute to another speaker, not to exceed a total of (8) eight minutes. The speaker wishing to defer time must be present when the item is heard. In order to be recognized and present an item, each speaker must complete and submit to the Recording Secretary a Request to Speak form prior to the beginning of the item being announced by the Chair (forms are available at the entrance to the meeting room). Speakers are taken in the order slips are submitted.

Items in Consent Calendar Section A have already been considered by the Commission at a previous meeting where the public was invited to comment, after which a decision was made. These items are not subject to public discussion at this meeting because the vote taken at the previous meeting was final. Resolutions concerning decisions made at previous meetings are for the purpose of memorializing the decision to assure the accuracy of the findings, the prior vote, and any conditions imposed.

Items in Consent Calendar Section B have not been discussed previously by the Commission. If discussion is desired, an item may be removed from the Consent Calendar for individual consideration. Commissioners may indicate a negative or abstaining vote on any individual item by so declaring prior to the vote on the motion to adopt the entire Consent Calendar. Items excluded from the Consent Calendar will be taken up by the Commission following the action on the Consent Calendar. The Commission first will take up the items for which public speaker requests have been submitted. Public speakers shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.



Items in New Business are items which are appearing for the first time for formal action. Public comment shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.



CALL TO ORDER

Chair Saul called the meeting to order at 5:11 p.m.

ROLL CALL

The following persons were recorded in attendance by the Recording Secretary:

PRESENT: Chair David Saul; Vice Chair Chris Frost; and Commissioners Marlene Matlow and Carol Randall

ALSO PRESENT: Bob Brager, Public Works Director; Travis Hart, Senior Public Works Inspector; Lieutenant Jim Royal, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Liaison; and Mary Linden, Recording Secretary

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Lieutenant Josh Thai led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Vice Chair Frost seconded a motion to approve the agenda with Ceremonial Item A continued to the November 2, 2016 Regular meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

REPORT ON POSTING OF AGENDA

Recording Secretary Linden reported that the agenda for the meeting was properly posted on September 28, 2016.

CEREMONIAL/PRESENTATIONS

- A. Administration of Oath of Office to Newly Appointed Commissioner Arnold Bernstein

This item was continued on Approval of the Agenda.

ITEM 1.A. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Hans Laetz discussed impacts of the Nautica Malibu Triathlon on residents in western Malibu. He stated lanes were closed or turns restricted during times when event participants were not on the road. He stated residents were not noticed of road and lane closures or

detours. He stated motorists should be able to turn around without going to Deer Creek. He expressed frustration that these issues were ongoing for more than 20 years of the event. He also expressed concern about the percentage of funds raised going to the organizers.

ITEM 1.B. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Commissioner Matlow requested moment of silence for the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Deputy who was killed in the line of duty today in Lancaster, as well as Los Angeles County Firefighter Scott LaRue who recently passed away. Vice Chair Frost requested Ventura County Fire Engineer Ryan Osler also be remembered.

Vice Chair Frost expressed gratitude for the installation of a turn lane on Trancas.

Lieutenant Royal introduced Lieutenant Josh Thai, Acting Captain of the Malibu-Lost Hills Sheriff's Station, and new Traffic Sergeant Brian Kehoe. Commissioner Matlow requested Sergeant Kehoe attend future Commission meetings.

ITEM 2 CONSENT CALENDAR

Recording Secretary Linden noted that the Agenda incorrectly listed the item numbers for the Consent Calendar as Item Nos. 2.B. (Previously Discussed Items) and 2.C. (New Items). She stated the minutes would reflect the correct numbering.

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Commissioner Randall seconded a motion to approve the Consent Calendar. The motion carried unanimously.

ITEM 3 OLD BUSINESS

- A. Election of Vice Chair (continued from September 7, 2016)
Recommended action: Accept nominations and elect a Vice Chair for the Public Safety Commission.

Recording Secretary Linden presented the report. She explained that City Council Policy No. 10 specified there shall be only one Chair and one Vice Chair.

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Vice Chair Frost seconded a motion to nominate Carol Randall for Vice Chair.

MOTION Chair Saul moved and Vice Chair Frost seconded a motion to nominate Chris Frost for Vice Chair.

The question was called and each candidate received two votes.

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Vice Chair Frost seconded a motion to continue the item to the November 2, 2016 Regular meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

ITEM 4 NEW BUSINESS

A. Public Safety Agencies Annual Service Review

Recommended Action: Review services provided by the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, Fire Department and Lifeguards, and make recommendations to the City Council for service level adjustments, if appropriate.

Recording Secretary Linden introduced Assistant Fire Chief Anthony Williams and Community Services Representative Maria Grycan, Los Angeles County Fire Department, and Section Chief Adam Uehara, Los Angeles County Lifeguards. She acknowledged Lieutenant Thai was available for questions about Sheriff's service.

Lifeguard Chief Uehara discussed year to date statistics. He stated the increased number of rescues was attributable to a very warm summer. In response to Commissioner Randall, Chief Uehara confirmed the attendance figures did not include State beaches. Lieutenant Royal estimated 7-8 million visitors came to Malibu between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

Assistant Fire Chief Williams provided an overview of Fire Department services. He confirmed the Fire Department made 2663 total responses, an average of 266 calls per month. He discussed a proposal to augment paramedic services by converting to Paramedic Extension Units. He discussed augmented staffing during high fire danger periods. He described how Pulse Point was saving lives.

Chair Saul discussed a Fire Department training exercise held today. He requested the Fire Department notify the City in advance so it could alert the public. Community Services Representative Grycan and Recording Secretary Linden confirmed the City had been notified.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Community Services Representative Grycan stated the aircraft were brought to Los Angeles earlier this year than in the past.

Commissioner Matlow asked if Malibu Fire stations would be able to respond to a major disaster without mutual aid. Chief Williams explained that each section would be responsible for its own in a countywide catastrophic incident, but mutual aid from throughout the state would provide assistance whenever possible.

Lieutenant Royal reported the Malibu-Lost Hills Station covers 186 square miles, providing service to Malibu, neighboring cities and unincorporated County areas. He stated there are approximately 100 deputies, including detectives, assigned to LHS in total across all three shifts plus approximately 30 more supervisors. He stated there are 13 to 14 deputies per day assigned directly to Malibu for traffic enforcement, crime prevention and response, with 14 Volunteers on Patrol (VOP) currently augmenting Malibu staffing. He explained that staffing surged during the summer by eight to ten deputies plus eight to ten support staff. He discussed changes in crime statistics this year compared to last year. He stated vehicle theft had increased in Malibu and throughout Los Angeles. He stated crime was up 6%, but even with 1.5 collisions per day in Malibu, fatal collisions were down from five to two over the past year. He discussed how the Sheriff's Department and the City were working together to evaluate and address PCH traffic issues. He commended the VOPs for their dedication and valuable assistance. He discussed the new Community Impact Team, which provided one deputy for each city to deal with special problems. He stated the station receives over 100 calls for service related to homeless per month. He commended Deputy Michael Treinen for his efforts with the homeless.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Vice Chair Frost stated riders in cycling events are not informed of special issues related to riding on PCH through Malibu.

In response to Vice Chair Frost, Lt Royal explained when cyclists can take a lane on PCH. He stated cyclists were required to yield on canyon roads if five vehicles were behind them, but that did not apply to PCH. He confirmed it is illegal to talk on a cellphone while cycling.

B. 2016 Summer Beach Enforcement Operation Summary

Recommended action: Receive and file summary report of the 2016 Summer Beach Enforcement Operation.

Lieutenant Royal stated the staffing and schedule was same as last year. He estimated crowds were seven to eight million. He noted an uptick in visitor numbers to Malibu over the past three to five years. He stated hot spots this summer included El Matador Beach, especially on hot weekends, and the Sheriff's Department worked with State Parks to monitor traffic. He stated increased use of Uber and Lyft by the public, along with DUI checkpoints and citations for Alcohol on the Beach, have helped reduce the number of DUI-related collisions on PCH.

In response to Commissioner Matlow, Lieutenant Royal stated City Manager Feldman had reached out to Los Angeles County Beaches and Harbors to ensure the Zuma Beach parking entrance was fully staffed. He commended the California Highway Patrol (CHP) for its use of changeable message signs (CMS) to alert motorists when lots were full. He stated the summer's success was a joint effort.

Commissioner Matlow discussed parking issues on Westward Beach Road. She stated motorists would basically park in traffic lanes waiting for a parking space to open. Lieutenant Royal explained problems with enforcing double-parking, including secondary safety hazards related to parking the patrol car.

Lieutenant Thai thanked the City, Public Safety Commission and the County Board of Supervisors for its support of the Beach Team. He commended Lieutenant Royal and Beach Team Sergeant James Braden for their leadership.

C. Update on Improvement Projects Recommended in the Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) Safety Study

Recommended Action: Receive and file status update of Improvement Projects recommended in the PCH Safety Study and provide feedback to staff.

Public Works Director Brager presented the report. In response to Chair Saul, Assistant to the City Manager Shavelson discussed the signal synchronization project. She stated it was expected to be complete by 2020. Public Works Director Brager stated the project would synchronize existing signals, including the signal at Topanga Canyon. Assistant to the City Manager Shavelson confirmed the project covered eight miles.

In response to Commissioner Matlow, Assistant to the City Manager Shavelson stated construction was anticipated to take approximately one year on a schedule determined by Caltrans. She confirmed Caltrans' regular construction hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. unless special permission is given for off-hour work.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Assistant to the City Manager Shavelson discussed design issues that stalled the La Costa crosswalk project.

Commissioner Matlow complimented all agencies involved in the projects listed in the report. Public Works Director Brager commended the VOPs for their assistance in the City.

D. Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets

Recommended Action: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) California Incline Bridge Replacement Project; b) Slope Erosion Project (Caltrans); c) Nautica Malibu

Triathlon; and d) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.

Senior Public Works Inspector Hart presented the report. Commissioner Matlow expressed concern about mud flow from bare cliffs near the California Incline.

Chair Saul agreed with Mr. Laetz and asked if future triathlons could include a turning zone so motorists would not have to go to Deer Creek to turn around but cyclist safety was still protected.

Commissioner Matlow agreed with Mr. Laetz about the impacts on Malibu West. She expressed concern about emergency vehicles getting to residents. Vice Chair Frost stated the event would be stopped to allow emergency responders to get through. Lieutenant Royal explained how traffic was managed during the event.

Chair Saul requested Caltrans be reminded to clear drains. Commissioner Randall requested Caltrans be reminded of unsafe conditions for making U-turns near the 20800 block of PCH 20800 due to a lip in the center lane.

In response to Chair Saul, Senior Public Works Inspector Hart stated he would confirm and report back on the City's plans for restriping streets.

E. Public Safety Agency Activity

Recommended Action: Discuss recent Public Safety Agency activities and receive and file monthly activity reports from the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, Fire Department and Lifeguard Division.

Lieutenant Royal stated his report was presented with Item No. 4.A.




RECOMMENDED ACTION: Accept nominations and elect a Vice Chair for the Public Safety Commission.







DISCUSSION: Below are the latest updates on the status of projects in and around Malibu that affect traffic and public safety on PCH and City streets:


- a) Point Dume Speed Advisory Signs: At the direction of the City Council, the originally-specified Traffic Logix SafePace 100 Radar Speed Sign has been replaced with a higher model Traffic Logix SafePace 600 Radar Speed Sign. This upgrade will allow City staff to personalize up to four messages, and conduct data collection and statistical analysis, reporting for average vehicle counts, total vehicle counts, average speed and total number of speed violations. The contractor has ordered the signs, which are scheduled to be installed in December.
- b) Bus Stop Shelters Project: The bid opening was performed on September 29 and at its Regular meeting on October 24, the City Council awarded the construction contract to J & H Engineering General Contractors, Inc. Construction work is expected to start in January 2017.

- c) Civic Center Wastewater Treatment Facility Project: The City continues its work on the construction of this project, which will impact traffic along various streets throughout the Civic Center area
1. Treatment Plant: The contractor continues to construct the treatment plant and its multiple structures at the project site on Civic Center Way. Lane closures along Civic Center Way were required beginning in mid-October, but that work has been completed, and there are currently no traffic impacts as a result of this work.
 2. Pipelines: The contractor has completed the installation of the pipelines along Malibu Canyon Road, Stuart Ranch Road and Civic Center Way (between Malibu Canyon Road and Webb Way). Additional traffic restrictions may be required throughout the duration of the project. The contractor will begin installing pipelines up the City Hall access road and lower parking area south of the City Hall building beginning next week. This work is expected to last for approximately one week. Traffic control on this segment of work will include alternating one-way traffic with flagmen. The contractor has its boring equipment at the intersection of Webb Way and Malibu Road, and is boring westerly along Malibu Road. Traffic control measures include an altered traffic pattern with shifted travel lanes and alternating one-way traffic with flagmen. The contractor has excavated and placed the new concrete foundation for the Legacy Park Pump Station and is installing reinforcing steel to construct the pump station walls. There are currently no traffic impacts related to this work except for the loss of a few parking stalls.
 3. Injection Wells: No field work is being performed at this time, so there are currently no traffic impacts related to this work.
- d) Caltrans Supplemental Adopt A Highway Program – Caltrans currently has individuals or groups that have committed to cleaning up litter on PCH through the Adopt-A-Highway (AAH) Program. Participants are only required to clean up their adopted area twice each month, but heavily visited beach areas are in need of additional attention during the busy summer months. At its Regular meeting on November 28, 2016, the City Council approved a recommendation from the Public Works Commission to pursue the Caltrans Supplemental AAH Program to remove litter along PCH in the Zuma Beach area (Busch Drive to Trancas Canyon Road) and the Surfrider Beach area (Webb Way to Carbon Canyon Road), from May through September 2017. The City will try to coordinate its twice-monthly pick-ups alternately from the regular pick-ups to better manage the extra trash that ends up on the highway during the summer. Following the completion of this five-month period, the City will evaluate the success of the program and consider whether to renew for future summers, extend the coverage area, and/or consider a full-year program for the future.

- e) PCH Parking Study – The City has scheduled a public meeting on November 30 to discuss the PCH Parking Study. An oral report on the results of that public meeting will be provided to the Commission.
- f) Caltrans Maintenance Work (PCH within Malibu) – According to Caltrans, highway maintenance crews performed additional paving operations to correct southbound PCH just north of Tuna Canyon Road after it was determined that the previous asphalt repair needed to be replaced. Caltrans crews also performed pothole repairs and cleaned various drains along PCH.

The Commission may provide staff with a list of questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans. Responses to those questions will be reported back to the Commission at its next Regular meeting.



SCHOOL ISSUES

We investigated a battery involving Malibu High students at an off campus party.

INTERVENTIONS

No interventions were held this month.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and is designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also address the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.
2. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. We met with Captain Pat Davoren throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. We entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. We made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the City of Malibu. We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. We met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.

8. We handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. We conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. The Juvenile Intervention Team assisted the COPS Team with Parole Compliance checks in Malibu, Topanga, Calabasas and Westlake Village.
11. We investigated 3 allegation of child abuse.
12. We registered 5 sex offenders.
13. We conducted 3 home checks of sex registrants.
14. We spoke to live-in patients at a Malibu rehabilitation facility re: drug laws and use.





COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and is designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also address the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.
2. Spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Pat Davoren throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our units investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. Made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the City of Malibu. We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. We met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.

8. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. The Juvenile Intervention Team assisted the COPS Team with Parole Compliance checks in Malibu, Topanga, Calabasas and Westlake Village.
11. Investigated 5 allegation of child abuse.
12. Registered 5 sex offenders.
13. Addressed Malibu Middle School parents re: cyber safety/bullying.
