The Oral Communication portion of the agenda is for members of the public to present items which are not listed on the agenda, but are under the subject matter jurisdiction of the Commission. Although no action may be taken, the Commission and staff will follow up, at an appropriate time, on those items needing response. Each speaker is limited to (3) three minutes. Time may be surrendered by deferring (1) one minute to another speaker, not to exceed a total of (8) eight minutes. The speaker wishing to defer time must be present when the item is heard. In order to be recognized and present an item, each speaker must complete and submit to the Recording Secretary a Request to Speak form prior to the beginning of the item being announced by the Chair (forms are available at the entrance to the meeting room). Speakers are taken in the order slips are submitted.

Items in Consent Calendar Section A have already been considered by the Commission at a previous meeting where the public was invited to comment, after which a decision was made. These items are not subject to public discussion at this meeting because the vote taken at the previous meeting was final. Resolutions concerning decisions made at previous meetings are for the purpose of memorializing the decision to assure the accuracy of the findings, the prior vote, and any conditions imposed.

Items in Consent Calendar Section B have not been discussed previously by the Commission. If discussion is desired, an item may be removed from the Consent Calendar for individual consideration. Commissioners may indicate a negative or abstaining vote on any individual item by so declaring prior to the vote on the motion to adopt the entire Consent Calendar. Items excluded from the Consent Calendar will be taken up by the Commission following the action on the Consent Calendar. The Commission first will take up the items for which public speaker requests have been submitted. Public speakers shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.





CALL TO ORDER

Chair Saul called the meeting to order at 5:09 p.m.

ROLL CALL

The following persons were recorded in attendance by the Recording Secretary:

PRESENT: Chair David Saul; Vice Chair Chris Frost; and Commissioners Marlene Matlow and Carol Randall

ALSO PRESENT: Bob Brager, Public Works Director; Travis Hart, Acting Public Works Superintendent; Lieutenant Jim Royal, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Liaison; and Mary Linden, Recording Secretary

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Detective Rich Curry led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Commissioner Randall seconded a motion to approve the agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

REPORT ON POSTING OF AGENDA

Recording Secretary Linden reported that the agenda for the meeting was properly posted on November 30, 2016.

CEREMONIAL/PRESENTATIONS

A. Administration of Oath of Office to Newly Appointed Commissioner Arnold Bernstein

Mr. Bernstein was not in attendance.

ITEM 1.A. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Ed Solomon stated he spoke to Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart regarding excessive speeding on Malibu Country Drive in Malibu Country Estates. He requested a speed advisory sign be installed at the southwestern side of the road to alert motorists to

slow down. In response to Commissioner Randall, Mr. Solomon confirmed he was requesting a movable, flashing sign.

ITEM 1.B. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

In response to Chair Saul, Public Works Director Brager confirmed the speed limit on Malibu Country Drive is 25 miles per hour. He stated he would look into what type of signage was available to install there.

In response to Commissioner Matlow, Recording Secretary Linden confirmed the emergency preparedness quarterly report was postponed until Emergency Services Coordinator Davis returned.

Commissioner Randall stated she attended the PCH Parking Study meeting on November 29, 2016.

Vice Chair Frost discussed cyclists and pedestrians moving unsafely on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH).

Chair Saul requested a Code Enforcement representative attend a meeting to discuss compliance with the vest ordinance and commercial parking lots charging for parking on busy weekends.

ITEM 2 CONSENT CALENDAR

MOTION Commissioner Randall moved and Commissioner Matlow seconded a motion to approve the Consent Calendar. The motion carried unanimously.

ITEM 3 OLD BUSINESS

A. Election of Vice Chair (continued from October 5, 2016)

Recommended action: Accept nominations and elect a Vice Chair for the Public Safety Commission.

Commissioner Randall stated she would not accept a nomination for Vice Chair.

MOTION Chair Saul moved and Commissioner Matlow seconded a motion to nominate Chris Frost for Vice Chair. The question was called and Chris Frost was unanimously elected Vice Chair.

ITEM 4 NEW BUSINESS

A. Mid-Year Report to the City Council

Recommended action: Develop a list of Commission activities from the period of July through December 2016 to be included in the City Manager's Mid-Year Commission Activity Report, scheduled to be presented to the City Council at its Regular meeting on January 23, 2017.

Recording Secretary Linden presented the report.

CONSENSUS

By consensus, the Commission agreed to include the following activities in its mid-year report to the City Council:

- Reviewed and provided input on the preliminary designs for projects resulting from the PCH Safety Study (September and October)
- Conducted a review of the City's Emergency Preparedness Program (August)
- Conducted the annual review of Fire and Lifeguard services (October)
- Reviewed the 2016 Summer Beach Enforcement Operations summary report (October)

CONSENSUS

By consensus, the Commission agreed to include Commissioner Randall's suggestion to add that members of the Commission regularly participated at PCH Task Force meetings to the list of activities.

MOTION Commissioner Matlow moved and Vice Chair Frost seconded a motion to approve the amended list of Commission activities from the period of July through December 2016 to be included in the City Manager's Mid-Year Commission Activity Report, scheduled to be presented to the City Council at its Regular meeting on January 23, 2017. The motion carried unanimously.

B. Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets

Recommended Action: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) Point Dume Speed Advisory Signs; b) Bus Stop Shelters Project; c) Civic Center Wastewater Treatment Facility Project; d) PCH Parking Study; e) Caltrans Supplemental Adopt A Highway Program; f) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.

Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart presented the report. He stated staff had repainted striping on Cliffside Drive in response to reports from Volunteers on Patrol (VOP) that they were having trouble enforcing the red curb zone on Cliffside.

Chair Saul read a message from Meril May about areas in need of Caltrans maintenance.

Commissioner Matlow discussed the need for regularly scheduled brush clearance at the Headlands to ensure clear sight lines.

Chair Saul requested statistics and data collected by the new Point Dume speed advisory signs be reported back to the Commission on a regular basis. Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart stated the signs were expected to be installed next week. Commissioner Matlow suggested the signs also be used in a disaster to advise evacuating residents where to go. Public Works Director Brager stated the signs were intended to be used for traffic management only.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart confirmed the locations of shelters being upgraded as part of the Bus Stop Shelters Project were located on PCH at Cross Creek Road, Heathercliff Road, and Trancas Canyon Road. In response to Commissioner Randall, Public Works Director Brager confirmed the City was paying for the bus stop shelters. Commissioner Randall requested the next phase of the project include a shelter for the bus stop located on the ocean side of PCH at the end of the Moonshadows parking lot. Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart explained this was a pilot project.

Public Works Director Brager discussed aspects of the Civic Center Wastewater Treatment Facility (CCWTF) project and where traffic impacts were expected.

Commissioner Matlow stated this was a perfect opportunity to underground utility lines. Public Works Director Brager stated utility lines could not be in the same trench as the wastewater pipes and lines.

In response to Commissioner Randall, Public Works Director Brager discussed future improvements to Civic Center Way and cross streets that are not part of the CCWTF project. He stated widening of Civic Center Way was in the design phase.

Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart discussed the PCH Parking Study public meeting held on November 29, 2016. He stated approximately 50 people attended, including Commissioners Randall and Matlow. He stated the City was accepting written comments through December 16. Commissioner Randall stated several in attendance suggested adding parking meters. In response to Chair Saul, Public Works Director Brager explained the goals of the parking study were to examine how many parking spaces were currently available, how to remedy what may be substandard, and identifying areas that could be made available for public parking.

Commissioner Randall stated the consultant discussed parking-related accidents on PCH. Public Works Director Brager stated the study would try to determine how parking may have been involved in accidents and what, if anything, could be done to correct those circumstances. Commissioner Randall expressed concern about a new accessway proposed on PCH, west of Moonshadows.

Chair Saul requested staff ask Caltrans about installing No Night Parking signage to reduce the number of vehicles parked on the land side south of Topanga Canyon Road. Commissioner Randall discussed a state law that allows recreational vehicles to park overnight on state highways.

Vice Chair Frost stated motorists were misreading the striping right of the number two lane at Trancas Canyon Road as a traffic lane, which was resulting in car mirrors hitting other vehicles.

Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart reported that Caltrans conducted brush and weed removal along PCH, between Webb Way and Malibu Canyon. He discussed signs that were being scheduled for installation.

Commissioner Randall stated she initiated discussion of the Topanga traffic signal timing at the last PCH Task Force meeting. She stated Caltrans responded that a problem with the software had been corrected, and the software was going to be upgraded. She reiterated her previous requests to correct a problem on the land side of PCH at Las Flores Canyon Road that made U-turns extremely difficult and unsafe. She stated she observed speeds of 57-60 miles per hour displayed on the speed advisory sign near her home in early morning hours.

Commissioner Matlow stated the sign on Cliffside Drive indicating the direction to access PCH was missing and needs to be replaced.

In response to Chair Saul, Acting Public Works Superintendent Hart stated restriping City streets was being discussed for implementation soon.

C. Public Safety Agency Activity

Recommended Action: Discuss recent Public Safety Agency activities and receive and file activity reports from the County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, Fire Department and Volunteers on Patrol.

Chair Saul asked if business trailers and vehicles advertising businesses could be cited and forced to move. He stated those vehicles were taking parking away from the public. Commissioner Randall stated other business representatives brought that up at the PCH Parking Study meeting because they were losing business when patrons could not find nearby parking. Detective Curry explained some trailers were being moved from one side of the road to the other to avoid a 72-hour non-

movement violation. Vice Chair Frost discussed business signs placed in the road or on the sidewalk that blocked motorists' sight lines.

In response to Chair Saul, Mark Russo, VOP, stated the VOPs were strictly enforcing the valet ordinance and most businesses were in compliance. He stated VOPs made sure valet operators and business owners understood the ordinance is in force both day and night. He stated residents using valets for private parties were an ongoing problem because they were not aware of the ordinance. Chair Saul stated he observed valets at Moonshadows not wearing vests during day hours. Mr. Russo stated VOPs logged their contacts with valets and reported regularly to Deputy Winn and the City's Code Enforcement office.

Commissioner Matlow asked why bicycle-involved incidents were not included in the Sheriff's reports. Detective Curry explained the system does not differentiate between a bicycle or a car for citations, but it should be indicated for collisions. He stated he would look into how data entry could correct that.

Vice Chair Frost discussed traffic violations at Webb Way and Malibu Road, including cyclists not stopping for the stop sign and illegal U-turns.

At the request of Commissioner Randall, Item No. 4.B. was re-opened.

ITEM 4B Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets (continued)

Commissioner Randall requested inadequate street lighting on PCH be discussed with Caltrans. She stated the City of Los Angeles has gone to all smart poles with superchargers and LED lights. Public Works Director Brager confirmed that street lights at all intersections and areas where traffic changes direction are owned by Caltrans and are all LED. He stated all other street lights are owned by Southern California Edison (SCE). Commissioner Randall requested the City ask a representative from SCE attend a future commission meeting to discuss the issue.




Subject: Code Enforcement Update

DISCUSSION: At its December 7, 2016 Regular Meeting, the Commission requested feedback from the City's Code Enforcement office regarding overall compliance with the new valet safety requirements ordinance (Malibu Municipal Code Section 9.38). The Commission also expressed concern about commercial signage which may impact motorists' sight lines, and requested clarification of the City's sign ordinance.

The City's Senior Code Enforcement Officer will be in attendance to address these issues and answer further questions from the Commission regarding the City's enforcement of safety-related ordinances.

Subject: Update on Projects Affecting Traffic on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and City Streets

RECOMMENDED ACTION: 1) Receive and file status updates on projects affecting traffic on PCH and City streets, including: a) Point Dume Speed Advisory Signs Project; b) Bus Stop Shelters Pilot Project; c) PCH Signal Systems Improvements Project; and d) Caltrans maintenance work; and 2) Provide questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans staff.


DISCUSSION: Below are the latest updates on the status of projects in and around Malibu that affect traffic and public safety on PCH and City streets:

- a) Point Dume Speed Advisory Signs: Five of the six Traffic Logix SafePace 600 Radar Speed Signs have been installed, programmed and are functioning. This includes four signs in the Point Dume neighborhood and one on Busch Drive. Staff will review and evaluate the data provided by these signs to determine the most effective location for future installation of the sixth and final advisory sign.
- b) Bus Stop Shelters Pilot Project: This project is currently in the construction phase and, at this time, the contractor is preparing the required construction documents necessary to install the bus shelter enclosures, including the construction schedule and sequencing plan, traffic control plans, City and Caltrans encroachment permits, Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan, and the fabrication and installation drawings (shop drawings) for the bus shelter enclosures. It is anticipated that these construction submittals will be received for review and approval in early January 2017, and installation of the enclosures will begin shortly thereafter.

- c) PCH Signal Systems Improvements Project: The City issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the project's engineering design services, with proposals to be accepted through January 31, 2017. The project will provide communication, coordination and controls between traffic signals on PCH and with the Caltrans Traffic Management Center. The project limits extend from Topanga Canyon Road to John Tyler Drive, a distance of approximately eight miles, and include 12 signalized intersections. Goals of the project are to improve the flow of traffic through the PCH corridor, reduce the incidents of collisions at signalized intersections and associated incident delays, regulate travel speeds, reduce overall traffic congestion, and improve safety for all modes of travel. The project will include street, intersection and signal improvements including communication links, adaptive signal control systems, changeable message signs, closed circuit television cameras, and traffic loops to enable Caltrans to monitor traffic flow, regulate speed, adjust signal timing remotely and to allow for real-time adaptive signal timing. In addition to providing communication, coordination and control improvements, the project will include intersection improvements such as relocating traffic signal poles, ADA upgrades, signal phasing, pedestrian countdown signals, overhead warning signs and associated striping, signing, concrete, asphalt, utility, and stormwater conveyance work.
- d) Caltrans Maintenance Work (PCH within Malibu) – According to Caltrans, highway maintenance crews performed brush clearance and weed abatement along PCH near Via Escondido, Zuma Beach and Surfrider Beach. Additionally, crews cleaned, treated and applied fresh, permanent striping to the Malibu Lagoon bridge deck on December 21-23.

The Commission may provide staff with a list of questions to be asked during the City's biweekly conference call with Caltrans. Responses to those questions will be reported back to the Commission at its next Regular meeting.



II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A Malibu transient was arrested for residential burglary in the 24000 block of Malibu Road. The suspect entered via an unlocked rear sliding glass door and was seen by the cleaning lady who immediately called the police. The stolen property was recovered. (16-06528)

Four subjects, residents of Glendale, Los Angeles and Las Vegas, were arrested for attempt theft of a vehicle in the 20900 block of Pacific Coast Highway. One of the suspect's was also charged for possession of a concealed firearm. (16-06157)

Two residential burglaries were reported in the 27900 block of Winding Way which occurred during the same date and time frames. In the other incident, surveillance video showed two suspects enter the property by jumping over a gate. They make entry into the residence via an open/unlocked door on the second floor of the home. The suspects are described as males, White or Hispanic, 20 to 30 years of age, wearing hoodies, masks and gloves. Jewelry, a firearm and U.S. currency were taken from this residence. 

SCHOOL ISSUES

We assisted STAR Deputies with transporting the Malibu Optimist students.

We interviewed a Malibu High student re: his drug use at his mother's request.

INTERVENTIONS

No interventions were held this month.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and is designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also address the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.
2. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. We met with Captain Pat Davoren throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our units' investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. We entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. We made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the City of Malibu. We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.


7. We met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.
8. We handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. We conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. The Juvenile Intervention Team assisted the COPS Team with Parole Compliance checks in Malibu, Topanga, Calabasas and Westlake Village.
11. We investigated 12 allegation of child abuse.
12. We registered 3 sex offenders.
13. We conducted a residence check of a 290 registrant.
14. We assisted Special Victim's Bureau with search warrant.
15. We presented a mental health seminar for parents of special needs kids at the Agoura Rec. Center.
