## II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A robbery was reported in the 23400 block of Civic Center Way. The victims were sitting in their vehicle charging it at the Tesla charging station when approached by the suspects. Both suspects had firearms and demanded the victims' property. Property stolen were two iPhones, cash and credit cards. (22-00449)

A robbery occurred at the 4200 block of Avenida De La Encinal. The victim and his girlfriend were in the area looking for a hiking trail. The victims were approached by the suspect (male Hispanic, 35 years, 5'8", 180 pounds) who stated the victims had to pay him money for being in the area. The victim and the suspect began to argue and the suspect grabbed the victim's sunglasses and assaulted him. (22-00438)

A Malibu transient was arrested for assault in the 3800 block of Cross Creek Road. The suspect attacked the victim with an unknown object on the upper chest area for unknown reasons. (22-00533)

An attempt residential burglary was reported in the 29400 block of Bluewater Road. A local transient was arrested for attempting to enter the victim's home by pulling on the front door handle. (22-00025)

A transient from Malibu was arrested for theft in the 3800 block of Cross Creek Road. The suspect entered the location and began to look at store items (glasses). The suspect asked for assistance from an employee. The suspect was distracting the employee while a second suspect (male White, 38 to 40 years of age) stole two pairs of glasses. The second suspect fled and avoided capture. These suspects also committed another theft in the same shopping area. A t-shirt was stolen in this incident. (22-00550)

A Malibu transient was arrested for the theft of a vehicle in the 6500 block of Westward Beach Road. The victim had parked the vehicle at the location, locked it but had left the spare key inside the vehicle which allowed the door handles to unlock when pulled. The suspect approached the vehicle, opened it and attempted to drive away with the vehicle. The victim saw the suspect inside his vehicle and ordered the suspect to exit the vehicle. (22-00284)

**SCHOOL ISSUES**

Assisted LVSD re: Counseling Center/student drug group

**INTERVENTIONS**

Counseled parents and juveniles re: incidents at parks, schools, and miscellaneous areas within our jurisdiction.

**COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

- ~~1. We conducted a monthly parental resource class at Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. This program was developed by our unit and is designed to educate parents about: 1) The current trends in juvenile behavior and delinquency, 2) Alcohol/narcotic awareness and recognition, 3) School policy and campus issues, 4) Gang awareness and negative peer relations, 5) Parental rights and responsibilities and, 6) Parental responses to incorrigible and/or delinquent behavior. We also address the specific concerns relating to the minor's behavior. We educate the minor and their parents of possible criminal behavior and the legal consequences. We offer suggestions and make recommendations to improve the minor's quality of life.~~
2. Spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with various juvenile resource programs within our community.
3. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Salvador Becerra throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. ~~Made court appearances to testify as witnesses on the part of the People of the State of California and attended court proceedings in cases generated from the City of Malibu.~~ We also investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office.
