II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A Malibu transient was arrested for assault in the 23000 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The suspect attempted to stab the victim (a surfer) with a knife because the victim asked the suspect to pick up his trash from the beach area. The victim was able to use his surfboard to block the suspect's attempt to stab him. (22-02654)

A Malibu transient was arrested for assault in the 23000 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The victim, a security guard for Malibu Pier, saw the suspect smoking on the pier which is not allowed. The victim approached the suspect, asked him to stop smoking and put out the cigarette. The suspect became angry and swung a frying pan at the victim striking the victim in the left shoulder. (22-02798)

An attempt residential burglary occurred in the 19100 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The victim heard a knock on the front door and did not answer. The victim stated the knocking continued for almost 10 minutes and she approached the front door looking through the peep hole and saw two males in their 30's. One of the males attempted to open the front door by turning the locked door handle. He then took out a pair of bolt cutters and cut a lock box off the front door of the residence which contained a key to the home. Once the suspect cut the lock box, both suspects fled the location with the lock box. These suspects also committed a theft, twenty minutes later, at a neighbor's residence. They cut the lock box located on a gate near the front of this home and then fled. (22-02607, 02611)

Eight vehicle incidents (seven vehicle burglaries and one theft from an unlocked vehicle) were reported in the 27200 block of Pacific Coast Highway. Four vehicles had their windows smashed, two vehicles had their driver's door lock punched, one vehicle had no signs of forced entry, and one vehicle was unlocked. These incidents occurred while the victims were hiking in the area. Property stolen consisted of backpacks, keys, cash, credit cards, luggage, laptop, camera, clothing, headphones, purses and wallets. Some of the stolen credit cards were used by unknown suspects at Target, Safeway, Michael Kors, Macy's and an Apple Store. No suspect(s) seen or heard. (22-02336, 02429, 02510, 02512, 02514, 02601, 02828, 02829)

Four vehicle burglaries (windows smashed) occurred in the 3400 block of Solstice Canyon Road while the victims were hiking. Purses, cash, wallets, credit/debit cards and backpacks were stolen from the vehicles. In one of incidents, the victim's stolen credit card was used at the Malibu CVS. In another incident, the victim's stolen credit card was used at a Chevron in Malibu. (22-02422, 02587, 02641, 02695)

SCHOOL ISSUES

Assisted Schools with behavioral issues, threat assessments concerns, suspensions, expulsions. Assisted LVSD re: counseling center, SARB meeting, Met with city of Calabasas Lana Filice re: Teen Court.

INTERVENTIONS

Counseled parents and juveniles re: multiple incidents at schools, and miscellaneous concerns within our jurisdiction.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with resource programs within our community.
2. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo throughout the month in order to keep him up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. We investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. Met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.
8. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. Updated the Gang Book and briefed the captain on criminal activity trends.
11. Registered 7 sexual predators and updated information in database.
12. eSCARS system updated.
13. Month End Reports completed.
14. Assisted Records Sealing Unit with several cases.

15. Assisted Patrol re: CARP, backfill behind patrol/shortage, mandatory overtime.

16. Assisted Malibu parents re: threat assessment, behavioral concerns, and criminal behavior.
