II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A robbery was reported in the 29100 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The suspect entered the location, showed a handgun to the victim/clerk and handed the victim a plastic bag. The victim attempted to open the cash register to give the suspect the cash inside but was unsuccessful. The suspect grabbed the bag back and took the victim's cell phone and exited the location. The victim followed the suspect outside and began to chase him. The suspect then shot the victim in the leg and fled in a red Land Rover. (22-03036)

A Malibu transient was arrested for assault in the area of Pacific Coast Highway and Serra Road. The victim was riding his bicycle in the area, saw some discarded property on the roadway and threw them away. As the victim was leaving the area, the suspect threw a dumbbell at him and hit the victim on the leg and damaged his electric bicycle. The property on the roadway belonged to the suspect. (22-03327)

A transient from Malibu was arrested for committing two residential burglaries and an arson in the 3500 block of Coast View Drive and the 31600 block of Broad Beach Road. In one incident, the suspect found the key to the location and made entry without the permission of the owner. In the other incident, the suspect made entry into the victim's unlocked vehicle and stole the garage remote control. The suspect then used the garage remote control to enter the home. The suspect set two fires outside the residence (wall of garage and near side gate). (22-03110, 03287)

A Malibu transient was arrested for residential burglary in the 27400 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The suspect made entry via the unlocked front door. (22-03138)

A transient from Malibu was arrested for residential burglary in the 21800 block of Pacific Coast Highway. Entry was made via the unlocked front door. (22-03192)

Five vehicle burglary incidents were reported in the 27700 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The victims were in the area hiking. In two incidents, the vehicles windows were smashed, two vehicles had the door keyhole damaged and in one vehicle there were no signs of forced entry. Property stolen consisted of purses, wallets, credit cards, backpacks, U.S. currency, prescription glasses, and ear pods. In one incident, the victim was able to recover two Tile GPS trackers that were found in a trash can in front of the Malibu Pavilion store. One tracker was found inside the store. One the stolen credit cards was used at a business in the 30700 block of Pacific Coast Highway. (22-02904, 02944, 03041, 03425, 03446)



ACTIVITY REPORT FOR JUNE 2022
MALIBU**

SCHOOL ISSUES

Assisted schools in the Malibu area with behavioral issues, threat assessments concerns, suspensions, expulsions. Assisted schools re: SARB meeting, School Graduations, School walkthrough for Active Shooter Training.

INTERVENTIONS

Counseled parents and juveniles re: multiple incidents at schools, shopping centers, community parks, and miscellaneous concerns within our jurisdiction.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with resource programs within our community.
2. We met with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo throughout the month to keep her up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. We-investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. Met with station narcotic detectives on a regular basis to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues. We have worked with the narcotic detectives on several narcotic cases directly and indirectly involving juveniles.
8. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit (i.e., Juvenile Information Forms, Field Interview Cards, Juvenile Automated Index, and citations for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel).
9. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. Updated the Gang Book and briefed the captain on criminal activity trends.
11. Registered 4 sexual predators and updated information in database.
12. Month End Reports completed.
13. Assisted Records Sealing Unit with several cases.

14. Assisted Patrol re: CARP, backfill behind patrol/shortage, mandatory overtime.
