## II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A Malibu Transient was arrested for robbery in the 23400 block of Civic Center Way. The suspect entered the business, selected store items, and exited without paying. An employee attempted to stop the suspect from fleeing. The suspect advanced at the employee with the shopping cart almost striking the employee. (22-05306)

Two suspects, residents of Alhambra and Los Angeles, were arrested for possession of counterfeit U.S. currency in the area of Pacific Coast Highway and Topanga Canyon Blvd. The suspects were contacted by deputies regarding a traffic violation. During the investigation, counterfeit bills were found inside the vehicle including narcotics. (22-05422)

A Bakersfield resident was arrested for residential burglary in the 22700 block of Pacific Coast Highway. Entry was made via an open window. Stolen property was recovered. (22-05183)

A Malibu Transient was arrested for robbery in the 3700 block of Cross Creek Road. The suspect with his companion approached the victim, also a Malibu Transient, and engaged in a verbal dispute. The suspect tackled the victim, assaulted him, and took his property. The second suspect is still outstanding. (22-04973)

A Woodland Hills resident was arrested for assault in the 23000 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The victim was walking on the pier of the location and saw the suspect smoking. He told the suspect that he could not smoke on the pier. The suspect got angry and assaulted the victim with a mug on the face. (22-05371)

An arson was reported in the area Heathercliff Road and Pacific Coast Highway. Suspect(s) unknown set fire to personal items (purse, shirt, cardboard) on the roadway. (22-05155)

A resident of Los Angeles was arrested for theft of a vehicle that occurred in the 23000 block of Pacific Coast Highway. (22-05321)

An arson occurred in the 6900 block of Westward Beach Road. Trash cans were set on fire between lifeguard towers #1 and #5. (22-05347)

**COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

1. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with resource programs within our community.
2. We inquired with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo throughout the month to keep her up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. We-investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. Met with station narcotic detectives to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues.
