II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A San Pedro resident was arrested for attempt murder in the area of Corral Canyon Road and Pacific Coast Highway. The suspect used a machete to assault the victim during an argument regarding the suspect who made an inappropriate remark to a sixteen-year-old female. (22-05526)

A Malibu Transient was arrested for assault and mayhem in the 30000 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The victim (also a transient) was approached by the suspect and suddenly attacked for unknown reasons. The suspect hit the victim with a pole and attempted to rip out one of the victim's eye using his bare hands. (22-05721)

A Connecticut resident was arrested for residential burglary in the 21400 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The suspect removed a window screen from a second story window and opened the window to make entry. The victim returned home to find the suspect in the living room. The suspect had taken a shower inside the residence. (22-05843)

A resident of Santa Monica was arrested for residential burglary in the 30300 block of Morning View Drive. The suspect attempted to enter the home by tugging on several doors in the backyard. The victim was home at the time of the incident. (22-05565)

A Malibu Transient was arrested for residential burglary in the 20700 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The suspect attempted to gain entry via the front and side doors. (22-05652)

A Norwalk resident was arrested for vehicle burglary in the 26000 block of Pacific Coast Highway. The victim was at the beach when he received a notification on his phone that his vehicle alarm was being triggered. The victim while walking to his vehicle saw the suspect break his passenger side window and take items from inside. The stolen property was recovered. (22-05686)

Twelve vehicle burglaries were reported in the 23200 block of Pacific Coast Highway this month. In ten incidents, the victims hid their vehicle key/fob on their vehicle. In one incident, the victim placed the key fob on the sand while at the beach. In another incident, the vehicle door was punched to gain entry. Property stolen consisted of vehicle keys, cell phones, wallets, credit/debit cards, a watch, sunglasses, and U.S. currency. In seven of these incidents, the victims received notifications that their credit/debit cards were used to make fraudulent transactions by unknown suspects.
