## II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

Two incidents of felony domestic violence incidents were reported this month on Pacific Coast Highway. In one incident a Studio City resident was arrested for assaulting his girlfriend. In the other incident, a Los Angeles resident was arrested for also assaulting his girlfriend. (23-03151, 03272)

A Los Angeles Transient was arrested for residential burglary on Broad Beach Road. This suspect was also responsible for committing another residential burglary next door. There were no signs of forced entry to both locations. (23-03034, 03038)

Eight vehicle burglaries were reported on Pacific Coast Highway during the same date and time frames. The vehicles windows were shattered to gain entry. Surveillance video footage showed one suspect wearing black clothing, a mask and blue latex gloves. The suspect was driving a dark vehicle and a white SUV was following the suspect acting as a lookout. (23-02602, 02605, 02607, 02608, 02610, 02611, 02613, 02614)

A resident of Los Angeles was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle on Malibu Canyon Road. This suspect was additionally charged with violation of probation. The vehicle was stolen from the jurisdiction of the Los Angeles Police Department's Olympic Division. The suspect's associate (a transient) was charged for identity theft for possession of debit and credit cards that were issued to different people and for a felony warrant for reckless evading. (23-03084)

Three suspects, residents of Hacienda Heights and La Puente, were arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was stolen from the jurisdiction of the Huntington Beach Police Department. During the investigation, several burglary tools and documents containing information that could be used for identity theft were found inside the vehicle. (23-02931)

A Los Angeles resident was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle on Pacific Coast Highway. The vehicle was stolen from the jurisdiction of the Los Angeles Police Department's West Los Angeles Division. (23-02944)

ACTIVITY REPORT FOR JUNE 2023  
MALIBU**

**SCHOOL ISSUES**

SMMUSD on summer break.

Coordinated with all schools (public and private) in Malibu that are serviced by Lost Hills Sheriff's Station to schedule safety walk throughs and critical incident tabletop scenario exercises (for staff).

Assisted Malibu Boys and Girls club regarding a vandalism incident at the Malibu High School parking lot.

**INTERVENTIONS**

Follow-up conducted regarding vandalism incident. The suspect was not at residence and spouse was un-cooperative, ongoing follow-up pending.

**COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

1. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with resource programs within our community.
2. We inquired with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
3. Met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo throughout the month to keep her up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
4. Entered juveniles into the Youth Diversion program for various violations.
5. We-investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
6. Met with station narcotic detectives to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues.
7. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel.
8. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
9. Assisted Patrol re: CARP, backfill behind patrol/shortage, mandatory overtime.
10. Conducted transient monthly Sex Registrations for 290 registrants in the city of Malibu jurisdiction.
11. J-Team followed up with DYD (Department of Youth Development) and Records and Information Bureau (RIB) to discuss proper record sealing procedures to develop a system of sealing juvenile records in an efficient manner once county diversion has been completed.
12. J Team attended and provided security for Malibu High School graduation ceremony.
