SCHOOL ISSUES

Assisted Malibu High School regarding multiple students involved in a fight.

INTERVENTIONS

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

1. The J-Team attended “Safe on PCH” meet and greet with students at Malibu High School.
2. The J-team attended the “21 Miles” movie screening at Malibu High School
3. The J-Team prepared for and held a presentation, “Under Your Influence” IMPACT, for Malibu High School parents.
4. The J-team conducted further follow-up investigations regarding a 2023 Sale of controlled substances to a minor case. Court appearances are ordered.
5. The J-team conducted follow-up investigations regarding Malibu High School students involved in a fighting incident. All parties were non-desirous of criminal prosecution.
6. The J-Team spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question juvenile concerns and community issues. We also provided the parents with resource programs within our community.
7. The J-Team contacted the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney to inquire about the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
8. Throughout the month, we met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo to inform her about our unit's investigations and current issues involving juveniles in our city.
9. The J-team entered juveniles into the Youth Diversion Program for various violations.
10. The J-Team assisted other investigators in preparing court cases and investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney’s office.
11. The J-Team met with station narcotic detectives to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug-related issues.
12. The J-Team handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals regarding various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel brought to the attention of this unit.
13. The J-Team conducted normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile-related calls for service.
14. The J-Team ensured record sealing procedures were initiated for subjects who completed CHAMPS diversion for minor offenses.

15. The J-Team aided in patrolling for CARP, filled in for any patrol shortages, and worked mandatory overtime.
16. The J-team conducted 290 residential verifications for sex registrants within the city of Malibu.
17. The J-Team Sergeant attended School Safety Assessment Training hosted by JRIC.
