The City has received FEMA's November 8, 2018 response to the City's appeal of the Preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps and Moffatt & Nichol's report dated February 2018.

As you are aware, the City of Malibu has just experienced the worst disaster in Los Angeles County, the Woolsey Fire. The Woolsey Fire started in November 8, 2018 and burned approximately 100,000 acres. The City of Malibu lost 439 homes. City staff has been working nonstop regarding the fire damage to and the potential mud and debris flows from storm events. The City has not had sufficient time to review and provide comments to the above mentioned letter.

Therefore, the City respectfully request an extension to April 8, 2018 to provide FEMA with comments regarding FEMA's November 8, 2018 letter.
