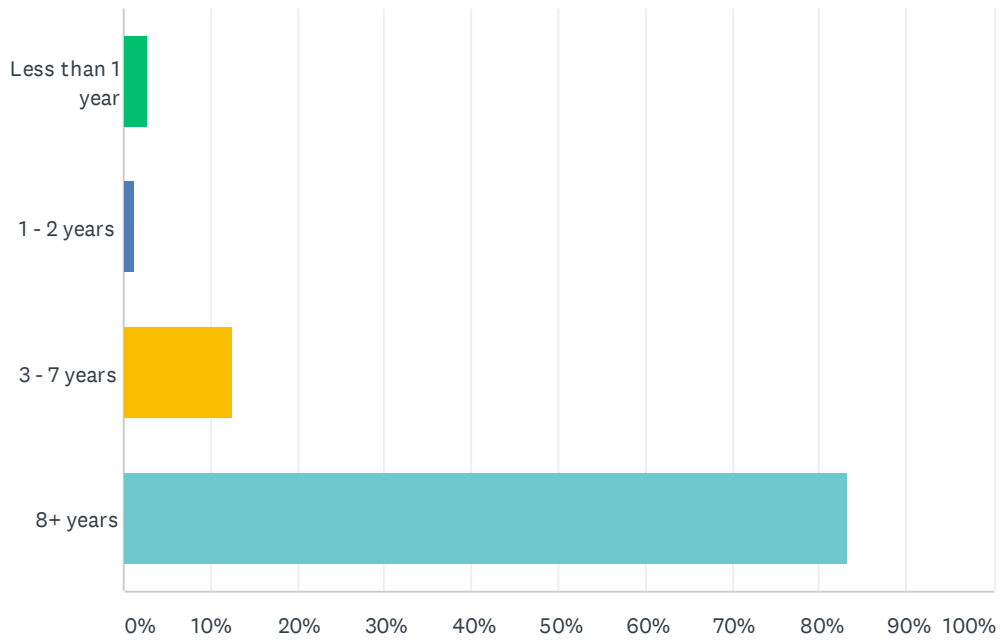


## Q1 How many years have you been a resident in Malibu and/or surrounding areas?

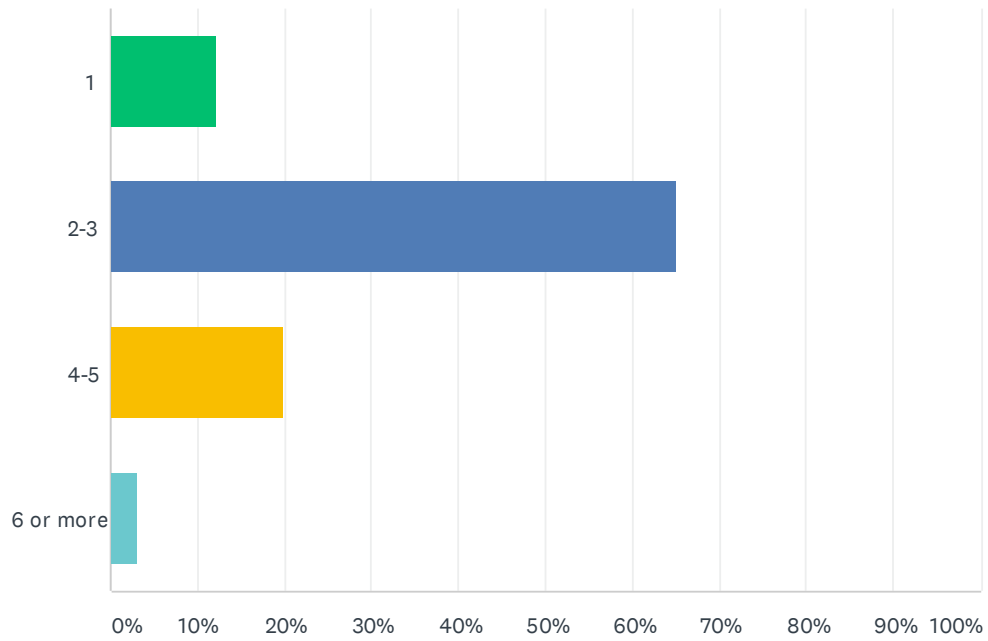

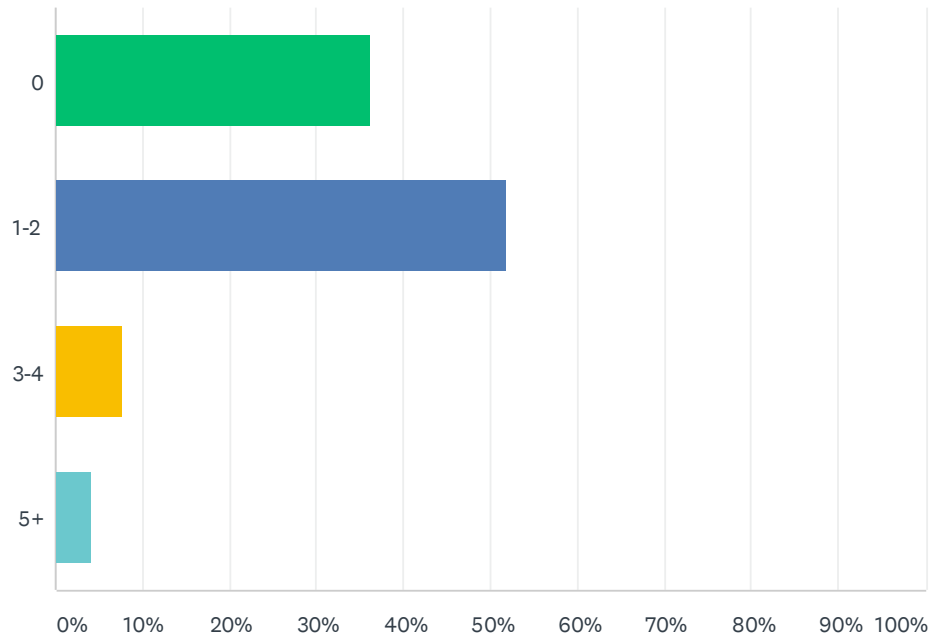

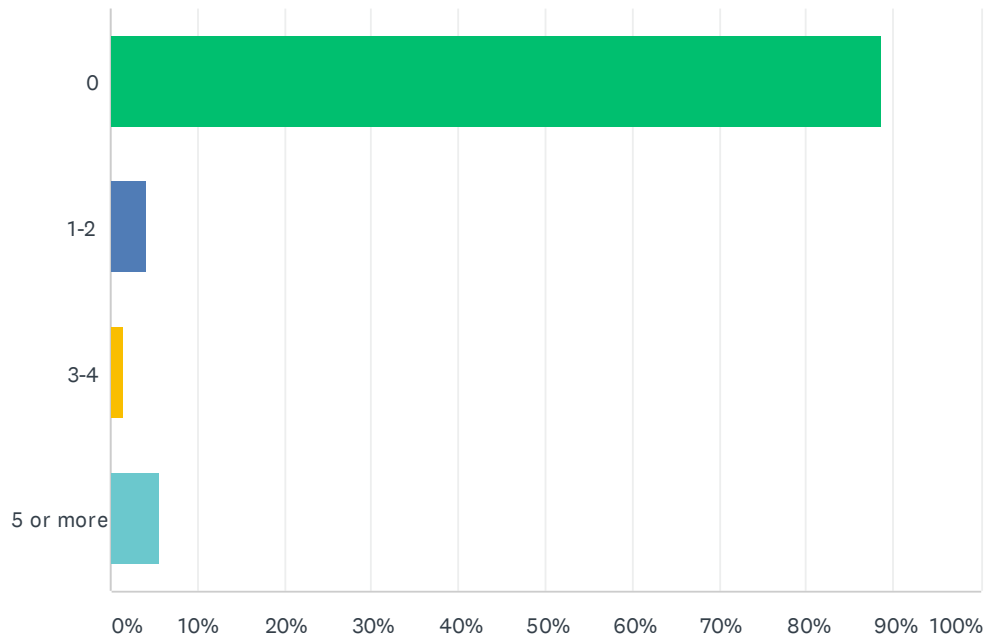

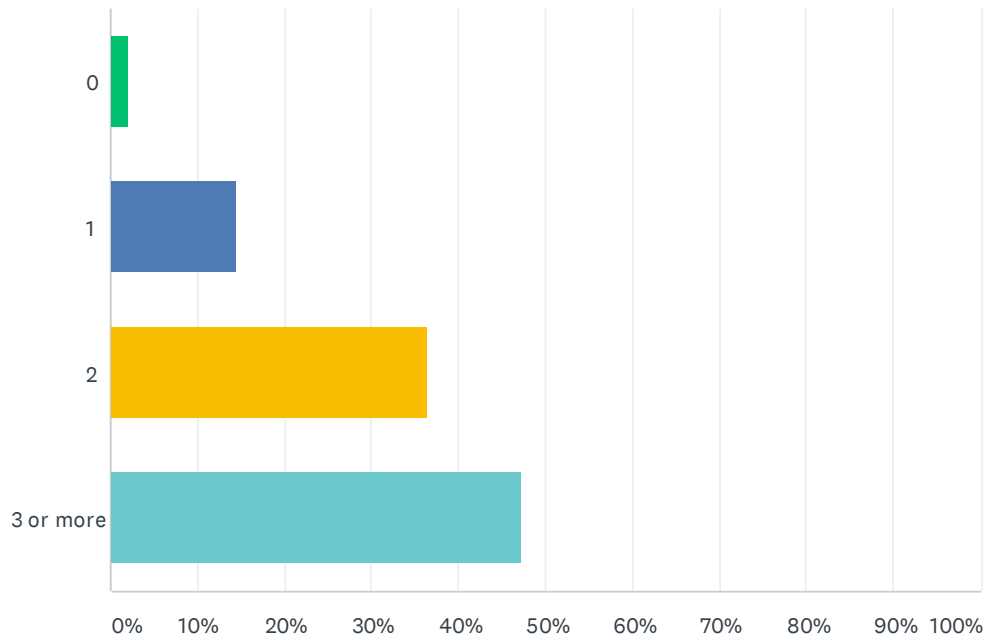

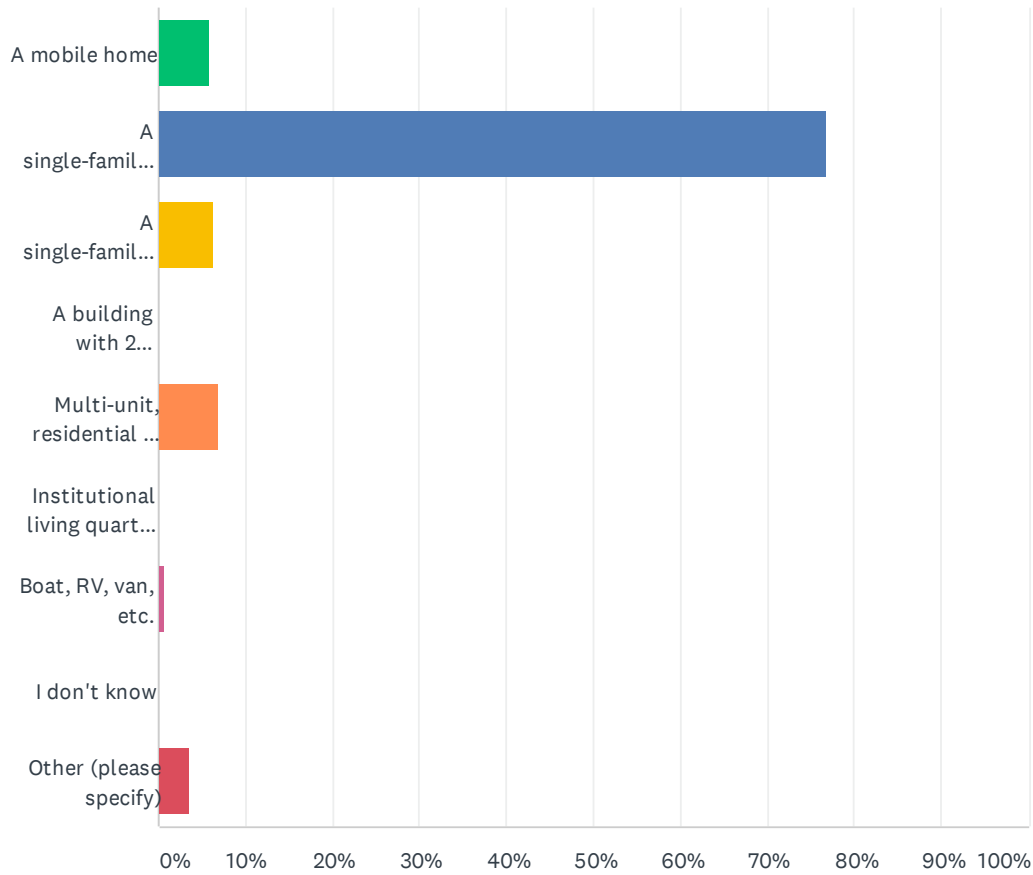

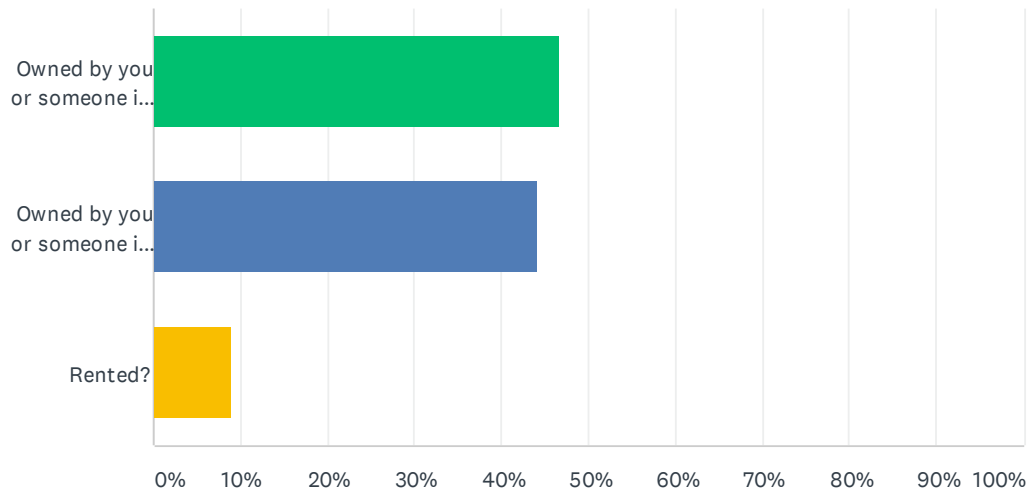

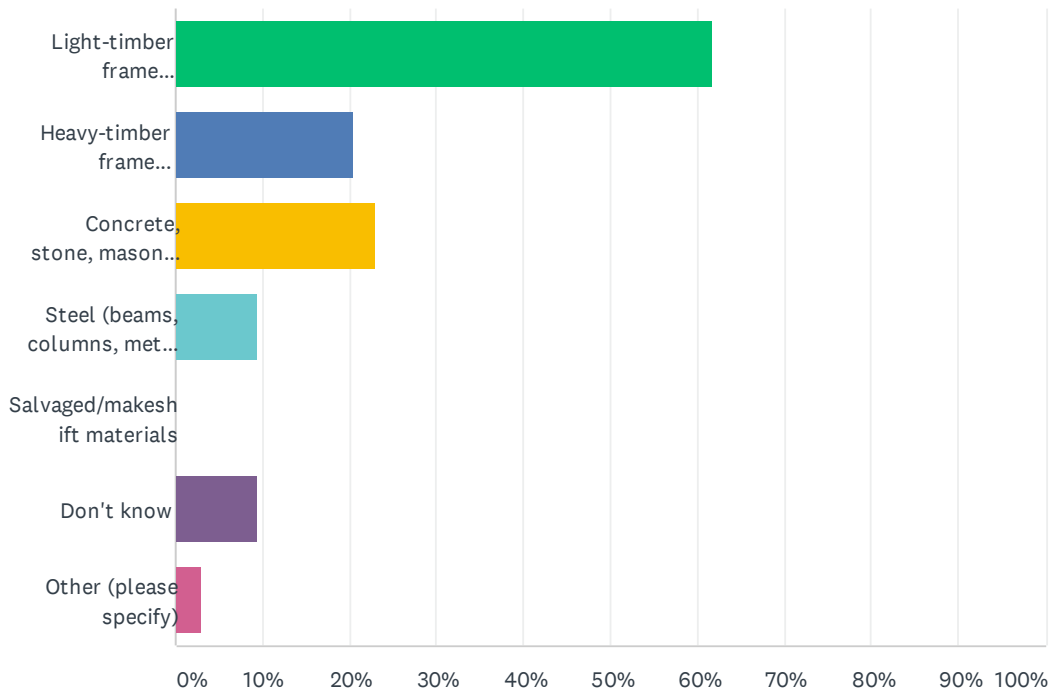

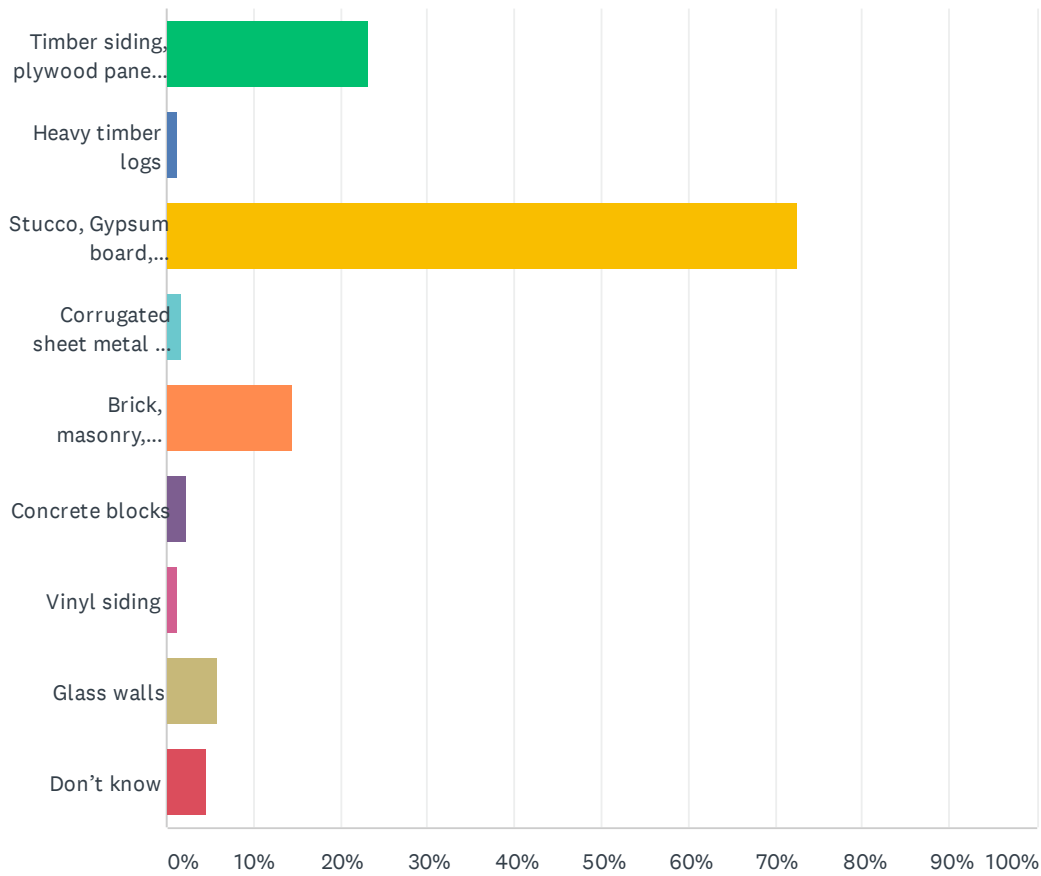

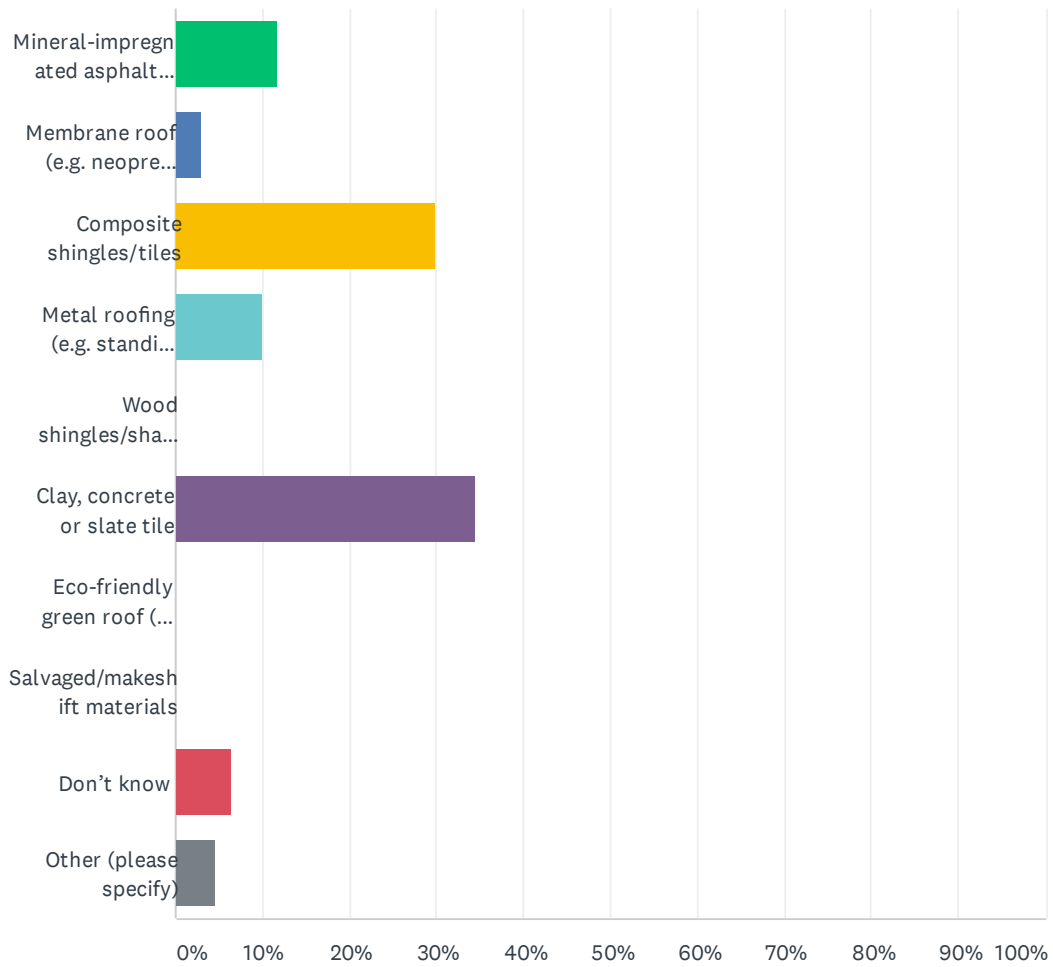

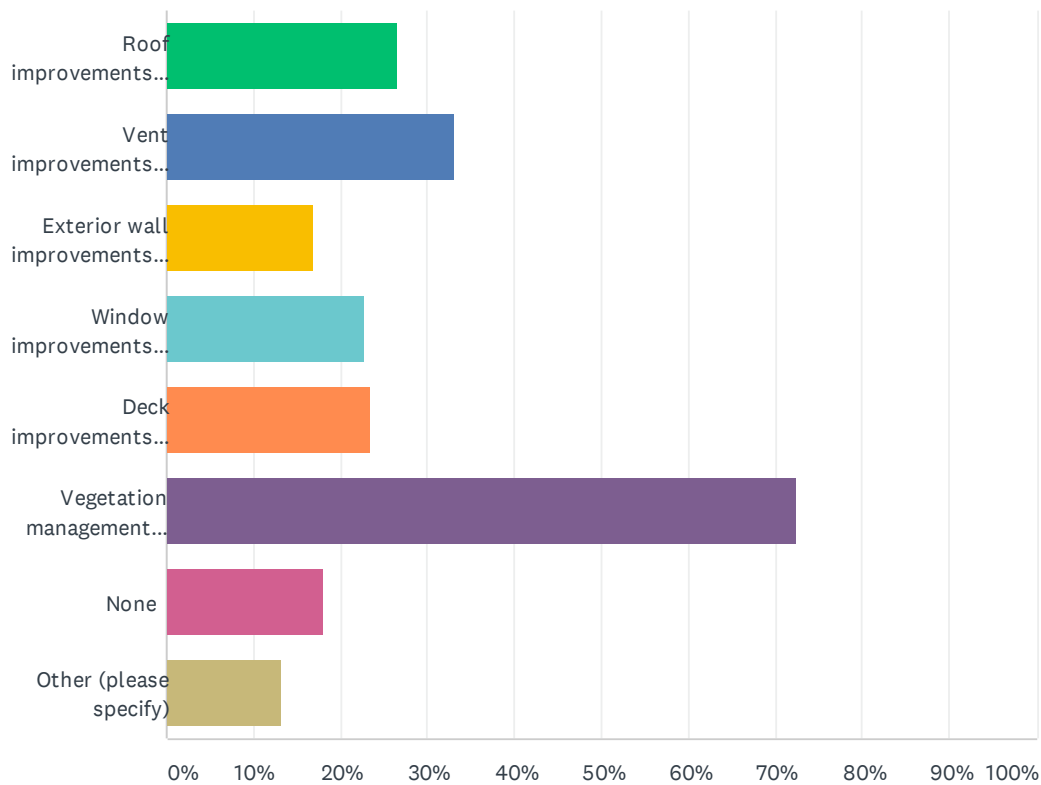

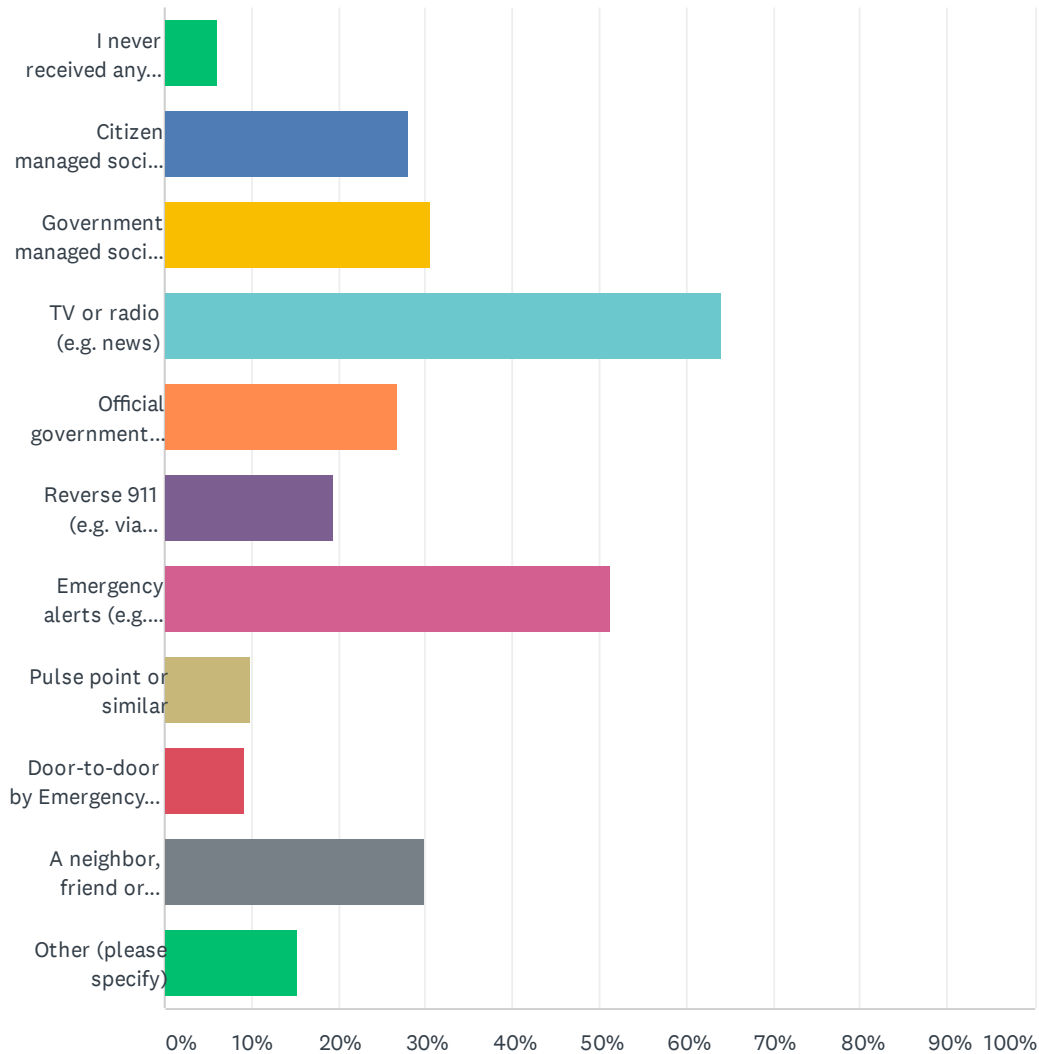

## Q28 When given a warning to evacuate, do you feel you were given sufficient information on how, where and/or what to do to evacuate?

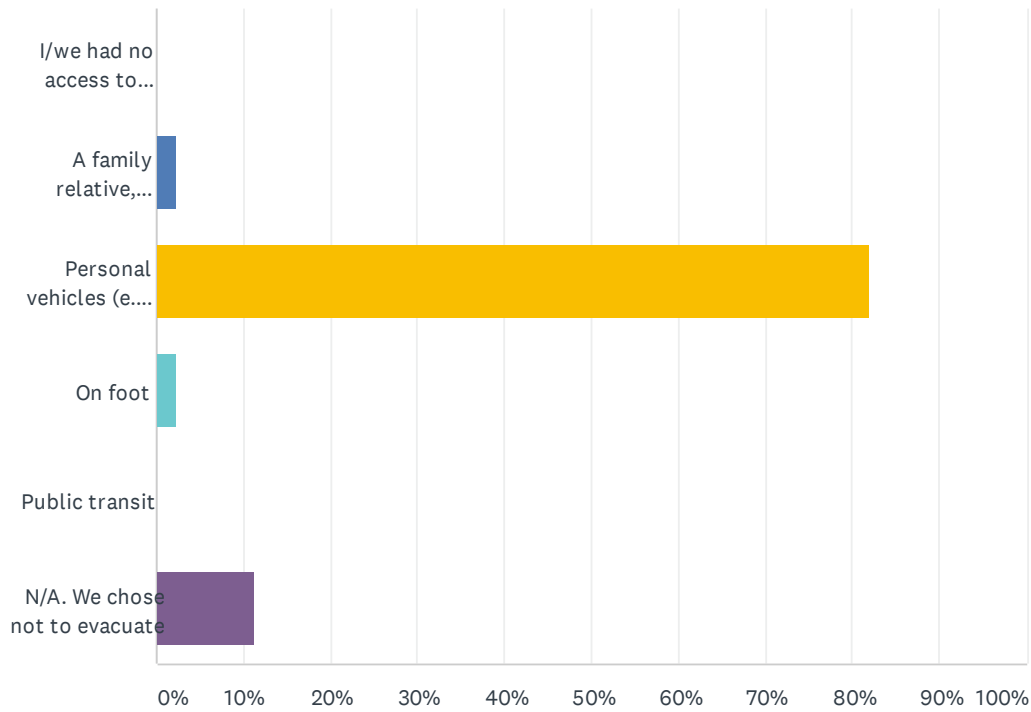

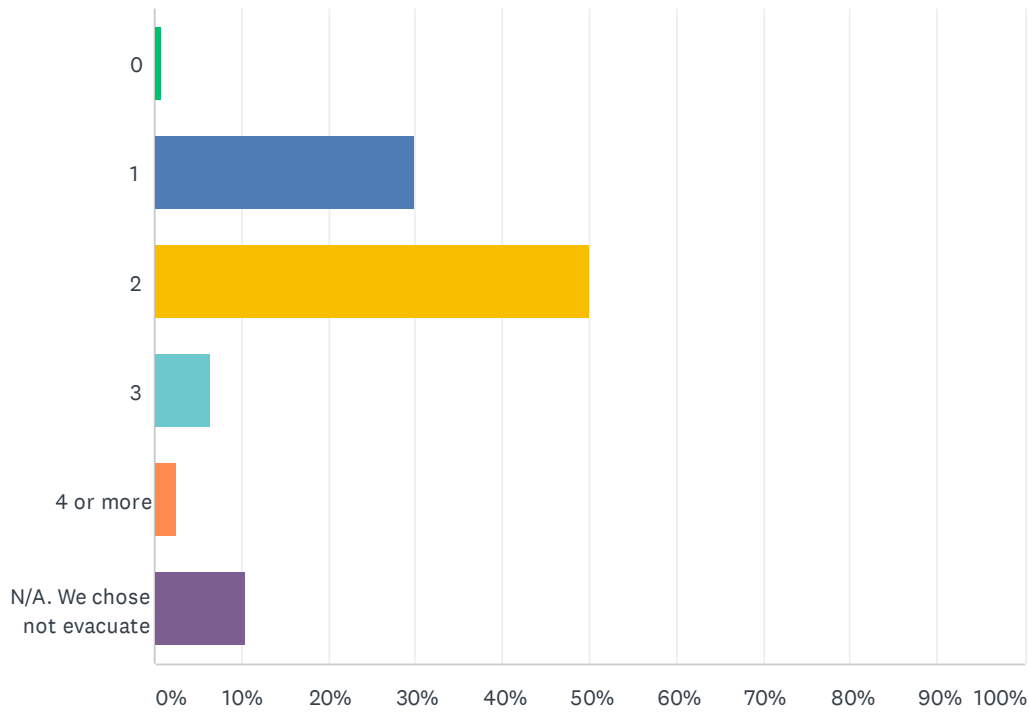

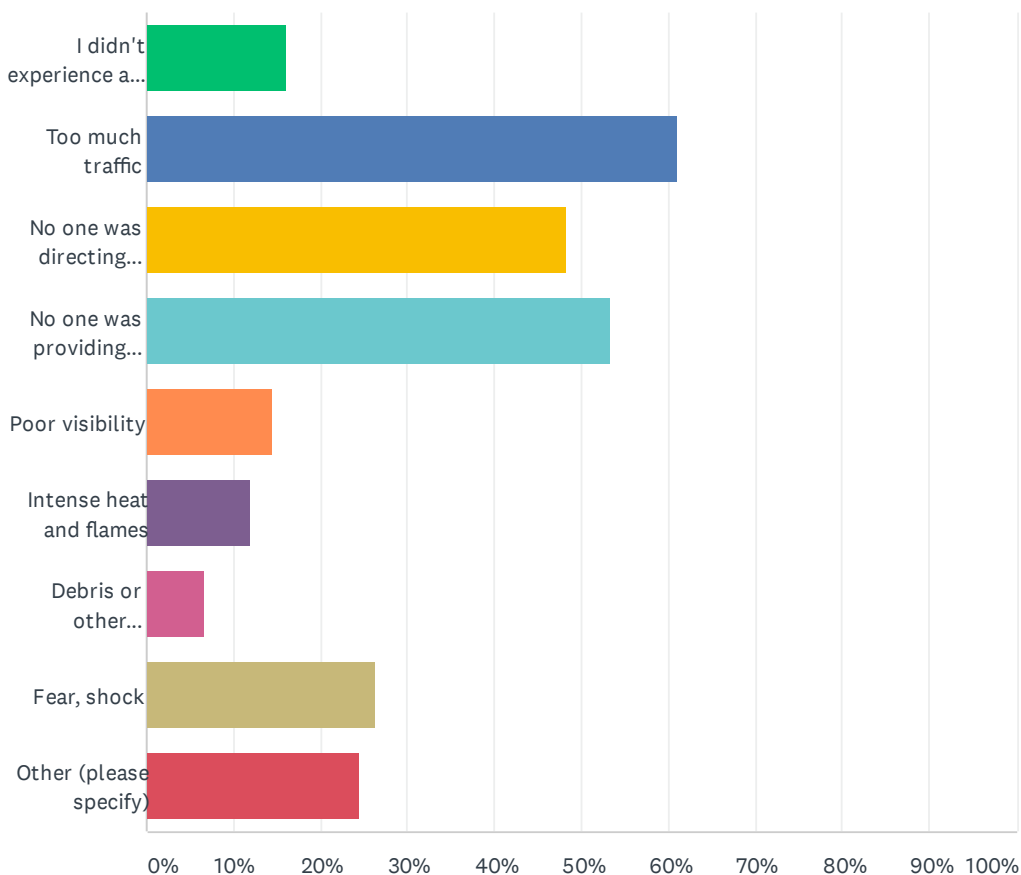

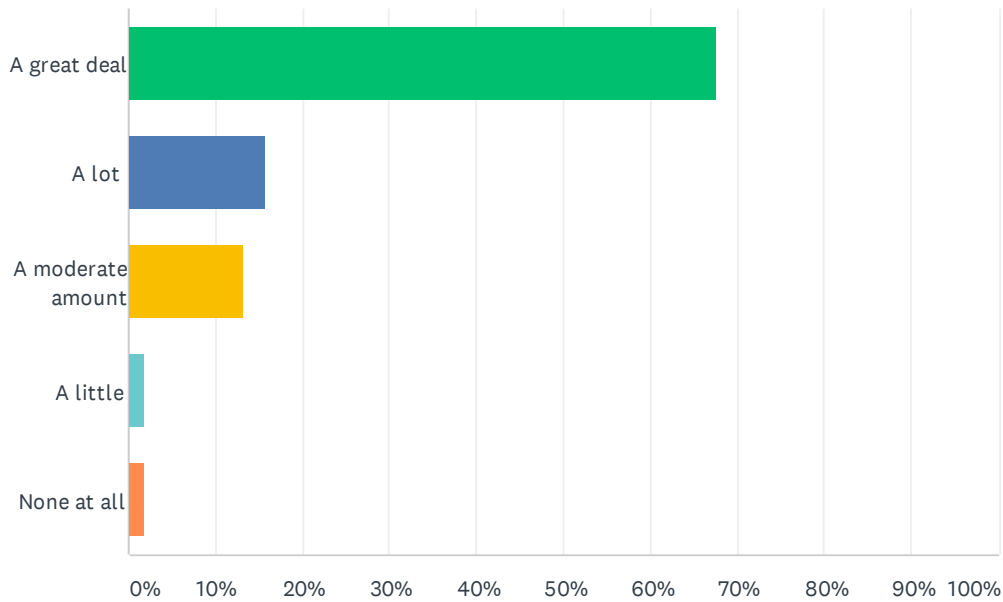

### Q37 After the 2018 Woolsey Fire how concerned are you about the future threat of wildfires in Malibu?

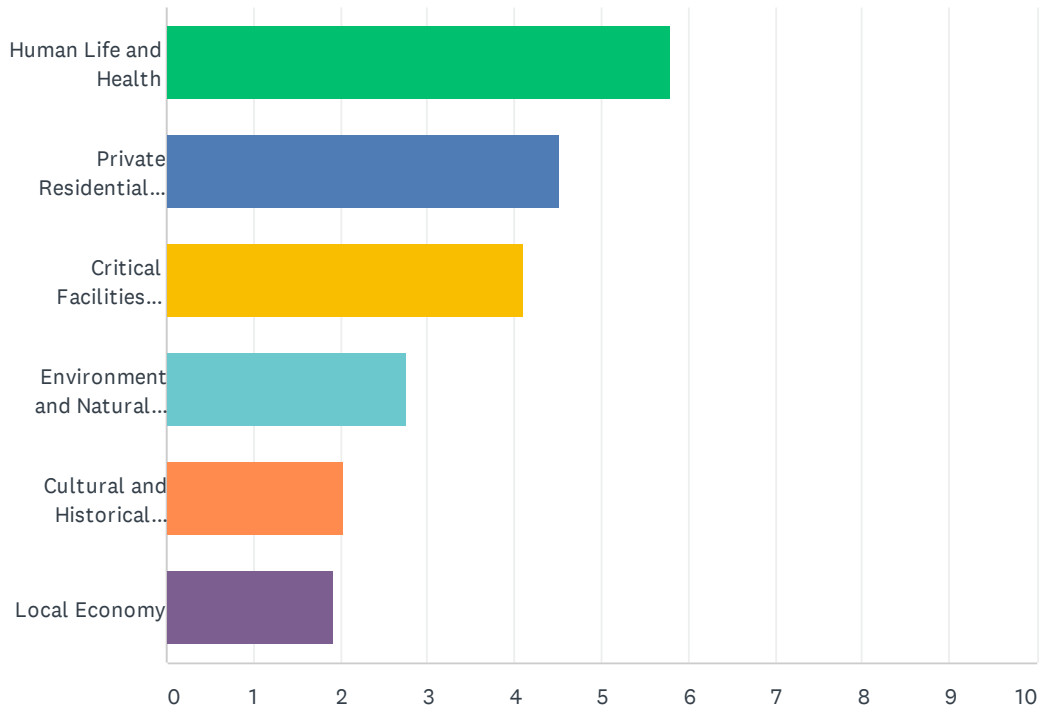

Q38 Please rank each of the following community assets/values in order of importance for protecting from wildfire threats with #1 being the most important to #6 being the least important.

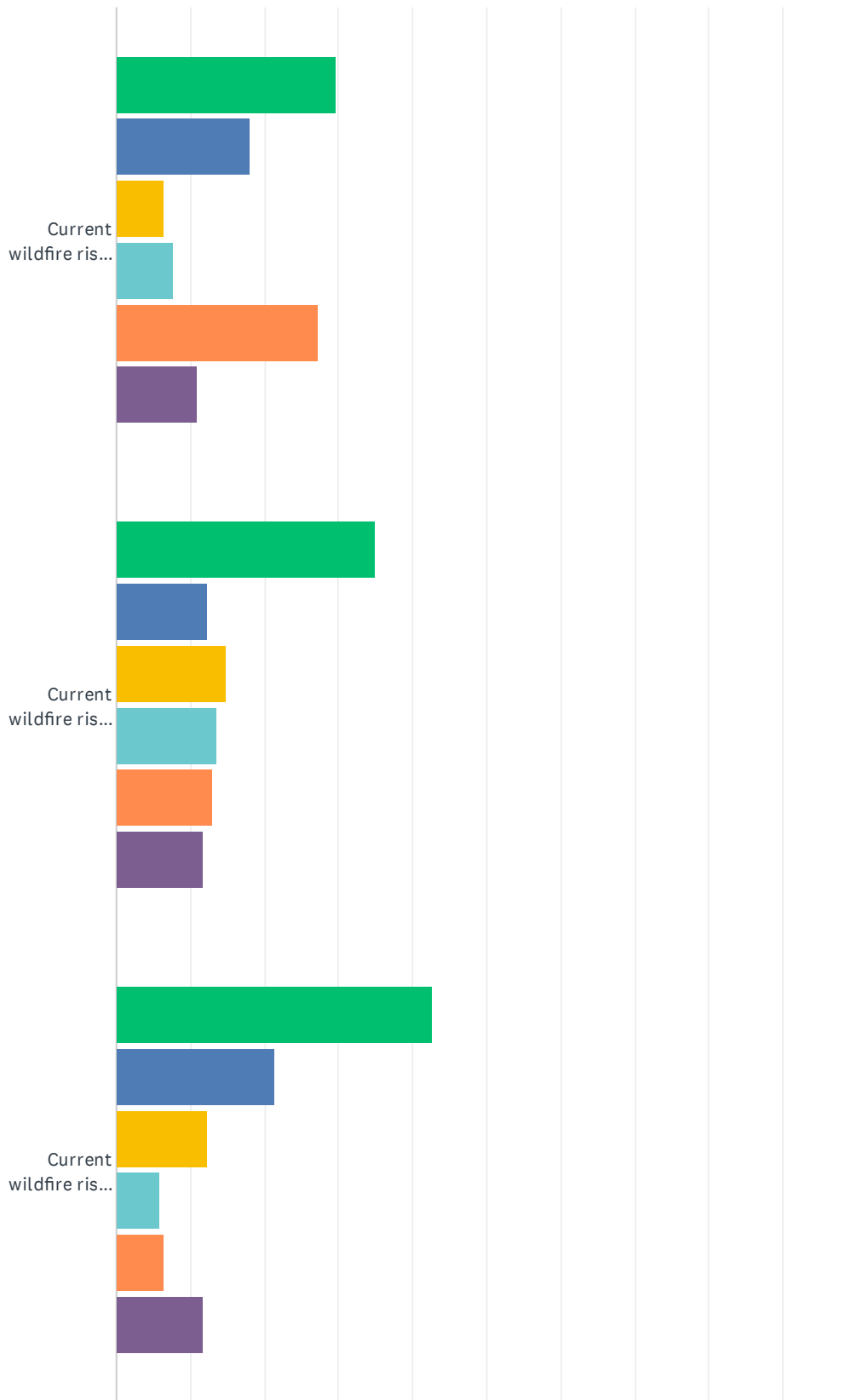
