

Recycling Bottles and Cans

You don't have to go far to recycle and get a refund on bottles and cans. There are many recycling centers statewide conveniently located near places you live and work that buy back empty California Refund Value (CRV) beverage containers. Recycle CRV materials in-store if buy back machines or a collector are not available outside. You may also use your curbside recycling bin at home or at the office.

Look for public containers at parks, plazas, and other places when you need to recycle away from home.



Malibu's Commitment

The City of Malibu is committed to protecting the environment and public health. In collaboration with local partners, the Environmental Sustainability Department provides educational programs, events, and workshops to the community to encourage stewardship and sustainable use of our local environments. Wondering what you can do to become more sustainable at home and at work? Here is a list of programs and simple practices to help keep Malibu a special place.

Clean Bay Eats

The City of Malibu, with the Santa Monica Bay Foundation, recognizes businesses that help ensure a healthy Santa Monica Bay. Diners are encouraged to support "Clean Bay Restaurant Certified" businesses that choose to go above and beyond the minimum requirements to prevent ocean pollution. Coastal Cleanup Day

Since 1985, more than 800,000 Californians have removed over 15 million pounds of litter from the coast. Visit the California Coastal Commission website for an online educator's guide www.coastal.ca.gov.

Coastal Cleanup Day is held annually on the 3rd Saturday in September. This event is a great way to show community support for our shared natural resources and learn about the impacts of marine debris.

Christmas Tree Recycling

The free collection event begins on the first business day after the holiday. Remove all tinsel, water containers, ornaments, and metal stands. The City will provide free disposal at drop-off locations. You may also cut your tree to fit in the curbside green waste bin. Call your hauler for information about special pick-up services.

Brush Collection. Since Malibu is located in a high fire zone, the City encourages citizens to recycle green waste and prepare for annual property inspections which begin June 1. For more information, contact the County of Los Angeles Fire Department at 800-994-4444. Thank you for clearing the hazardous vegetation and keeping our community a safe place.

Bulky Item Pick-Up. Need to get rid of a mattress, sofa, or refrigerator? Waste Management offers a free collection in the fall. Be sure to schedule the required appointment. A maximum of 7 items per household accepted.

Smart Gardening

This County program teaches how to reduce your impact by reusing green waste. Smart Gardening methods conserve water and energy, recycle yard and kitchen waste, all while improving your landscape and protecting the environment. Find a schedule of local workshops here www.SmartGardening.com.

Document Shredding

The City offers free shredding events in the fall and the spring. Protect your identity and recycle old tax forms, personal records, checks, and more. Collection ends if the truck fills to capacity.



Clean LA - County HHW Program >>>

The County's comprehensive program allows you to properly dispose of a variety of household hazardous waste (HHW) like pesticides, oil-based paint, and other chemicals. For dates, locations, and a list of accepted items, call 800-253-2652 or visit www.cleanLA.com (15 gallons or 125 pounds maximum). Business waste is not accepted.

Oil and Paint Roundup & Electronic Waste Recycling >>>

The City collects used motor oil, automotive fluids, latex paint, batteries, compact fluorescent light bulbs, and E-waste. The drop-off events are held at City Hall from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM on the 3rd Saturday in *February, April, June, August, October, and December*. The maximum amount accepted per trip is 15 gallons or 125 pounds. Rain cancels the event.
