




# LANDSCAPING POLICY CHANGE FOR RESILIENCY



## CITY OF MALIBU MALIBU REBUILDS

The City is encouraging residents to replace their fire damaged landscapes with native plants which help to rebuild lost habitat. The list below contains commonly planted native species recommended by the [Malibu Monarch Project](#) that can be used to create pollinator gardens to support monarch butterflies. A more comprehensive list of species appropriate for the Santa Monica Mountains can be found here ([MalibuCity.org/NativePlants](#)).

Please note that the planting of trees, shrubs and hedges that have the potential to grow over six feet in height requires approval from City Planning staff. If you are replacing Woolsey Fire damaged or destroyed vegetation, Planning staff can assist you by processing an expedited Planning Verification approval. # DEBRIS REMOVAL



- Collaborated with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to remove debris for **435 homes** in **4 months**.
- Supported **191 property owners** with private debris removal efforts and **19** more for damaged homes - **210 total**.
- Coordinated with **over 300 property owners** to pump septic systems of hazardous debris and cap to avoid further damage.
- All Malibu properties have been **fully cleared** of hazardous debris.


## Edible Food Recovery



- Cover Storm Drains**  
Before starting an outdoor project, look for drains and protect them from pollution, including water runoff.
- Contain & Dispose**  
Depending on what is in the dirty water, you may be able to use it on landscaping, dispose of it in a wastewater system, or it may require special disposal as hazardous waste.
- Non-Toxic Cleaners**  
Protect your own health and the environment by using natural and eco-friendly products.
- Go to a Car Wash**  
The water is recycled and there isn't any runoff.
- Clean Spills with Cat Litter**  
Works great to absorb wet or greasy spills and easily sweeps or vacuums up for disposal.
- Only Rain in the Drain**  
When in doubt, remember only rain belongs in the storm drain.
- Pools**  
Never let pool water go to the street, storm drain, creek or beach. Drain water to landscaping or truck it to a wastewater facility.
- Bucket & Mop**  
Mops and rags use minimal water to get the job done and won't send dirty water down the street or drain.
- Use a Broom**  
Waterless cleaning methods are always your best bet.
- Recycle Hazardous Waste**  
Drop off toxic materials and electronic waste at a local collection event.
